

Furthermore, regular practise of times tables through the TT Rockstars platform can significantly improve your child's mathematical fluency, a vital component of their overall academic success through the maths curriculum.

As a parent, I fully understand the demands of daily life, but please try to make time for these home learning activities. By working together, we can ensure that your child has the necessary tools to thrive in their educational journey with us and into later life. Use of the Adventure Playground Equipment

I would like to remind all children and parents of the rules for the use of our Adventure Playground Equipment:

- The playground equipment can only be used under the strict supervision of school staff during the school day.
- The playground equipment must not be used before or after school, even under the supervision of a parent, unless your child is attending our Breakfast or After School Club (where they will be supervised by a member of school staff).
- The playground equipment must not be used when visiting the school site for any other reason (for example holiday club or football matches).
- When children arrive for school between 8.40 am and 8.50 am, they should proceed straight to their classrooms and not stay on the playground or use the playground equipment.

Keeping children off the playground equipment before and after school is, for everyone's safety. Children get opportunities during play times and lunchtimes to access this equipment. Please support us in keeping your child/children safe and respecting the wishes of the school. Thank you
